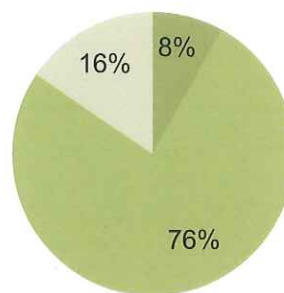


**Spending:**

a total of 37,658 people reached

■ **Food Security:**

**(1) Feeding project:**

- 401 evacuees in three evacuation centers received well balanced warm meals.
- 210 evacuees in other three evacuation center received well balanced warm meals.
- 400 households of evacuees staying in their own damaged houses received packs of rice and miso (soy bean paste)

**(2) Support for local restaurants and dining shops to resume their businesses:**

- 15 shop owners who lost their own shops were supported by pickup truck market project.
- A total of 25 restaurants, bars and food related shops received equipment and tools for resuming their businesses.

**(3) Voucher for the procurement of food and food related items / Provision of food (rice and miso):**

- 147 households in Yamada town benefited from by the voucher system.
- 259 households in Otsuchi town benefitted from the provision of food.

■ **Psychosocial Support:**

**(1) Community café:**

- A total of 1,567 people participated in community café from June to December 2011.

**(2) Recreational events:**

- 300 people joined for the musical in Miyako city.
- 1,000 people joined for harvesting festival in Otsuchi town.

**(3) Festival support:**

- 600 participated in the festival in Yamada town and Otsuchi town in July
- 5,000 participated in the festival in Yamada town and Otsuchi town in September

**(4) Local community newspaper:**

- 9 newsletters of 7,700 printings reached evacuees staying in evacuation centers in Yamada town every 10 days from May to July.
- 1,910 households of temporary houses in Yamada town received the newspaper 4 times every month from September to December (8,400 printings).
- 2,000 households of Otsuchi town received the newspaper twice (4,000 printings).
- 1 newsletters of 1,200 printings reached 482 households of Taro area of Miyako city December.

■ **Community Relief:**

**(1) Provision of household appliances with catalogue shopping system:**

- 563 households benefitted from this provision in Kamaishi city

**(2) Support for welfare institutions with the provision of items necessary for resuming their service:**

- 20 elderly a day in Kamaishi city and Yamada town benefitted from the welfare vehicles.
- 50 elderly a day in Kamaishi city and Yamada town benefitted from exercise equipment and tools.

**(3) Support for town taxi companies with the provision of vehicles as transportation means for vulnerable people staying in temporary housing:**

- 500 elderly, pregnant women and disabled people benefitted from communal bus service in Otsuchi town.

**(4)Support for schools to resume their educational curriculum:**

- 58 students in Otsuchi Junior High School with the provision of sport uniforms.
- 179 students in Otsuchi Junior High School with the provision of learning materials.
- 38 students in Miyako Technical High School with the provision of sports equipment.
- 99 students in Miyako Fishery High School with the provision of cutter ships and one generator.
- 115 students in Kirikiri Elementary School with the provision of musical instruments.

**(5)NFI:**

- 1,100 people in Yamada town and Otsuchi town with the provision of original CARE T-shirts.
- 18,800 people in Miyako city, Yamada town, Otsuchi town and Kamaishi city with the provision of summer blankets.
- 220 people in Yamada town with the provision of tatami mattresses.
- 1,400 households in Miyako city and Kamaishi city with the provision of packages of insect repellents.
- 3,000 volunteers in Yamada town with the provision of sandbags for cleaning debris.
- 40 volunteers in Otsuchi town benefitted from with the provision of heaters.
- 200 people a day in Otsuchi town and Kamaishi city benefitted from bus-stop benches.
